ABOUT

Created by the same minds that brought the world *Les Misérables*, Alain Boublil and Claude-Michel Schönberg,

Miss Saigon is a heart-wrenching story of love and loss set in war-torn Vietnam, and has

been described as one of the greatest musicals of all time.

The musical tells the story of a young Vietnamese woman named Kim, who is orphaned by war and forced to work in a bar run by a notorious character known as The Engineer. There she meets and falls in love with an American G.I. named Chris, but they are torn apart by the fall of Saigon. For three years, Kim goes on an epic journey of survival to find her way back to Chris, who has no idea he's fathered a son.



Since its premiere in London in 1989, Miss Saigon has won over 70 major theatre awards, including two Olivier Awards, three Tony Awards, and four Drama Desk Awards. It has been seen by 38 million people worldwide and performed in 15 different languages in 32 countries and 373 cities.

Cameron Mackintosh's new production of Miss Saigon opened in London in May 2014 to record-breaking advance sales and critical acclaim, it then opened on Broadway and a hugely successful US Tour followed with The New Yorker calling it "A Dynamite Broadway Revival". The Daily Telegraph (UK) wrote, "This thrilling new production spills out beyond theatre and speaks directly to the times we live in - magnificent performances." The Daily Mail said, "The greatest musical of all-time just got even better!" and The London Times called the production "thrilling, soaring and spectacular." Miss Saigon features music by Claude-Michel Schönberg with lyrics by Richard Maltby Jr. and Alain Boublil, adapted from original French lyrics by Alain Boublil, with additional lyrics by Michael Mahler.

The new production is directed by Laurence Connor with musical staging by Bob Avian and additional choreography by Geoffrey Garratt. Production design is by Matt Kinley and Totie Driver, based on an original concept by Adrian Vaux; costume design by Andreane Neofitou; lighting design by Bruno Poet; projections by Luke Halls; sound design by Mick Potter; and orchestrations by William David Brohn. Music supervision is by Alfonso Casado Trigo and Guy Simpson.





1989

PREMIERE

Miss Saigon premiered at the Theatre Royal, Drury Lane, in the West End on September 20, 1989. It played there continuously until 30 October 1999, for a total of 4,264 performances.

1991-2001

BROADWAY

The original New York production opened on 11 April 1991 with record advance ticket sales of \$37 million and had become the sixth longest running show on Broadway when it closed on 28 January 2001. It had grossed more than \$266 million and been seen by six million people. Today it remains the fourteenth longest running show in Broadway history.

2018-2020

US TOUR

US Tour September 2018 - March 2020.

A team including Claude-Michel Schönberg, Alain Boublil and Richard Maltby Jr, began writing lyrics, retained the theme but relocated everything to 1970s Saigon during the Vietnam War.

Opened at the Capitol Theatre, Sydney on 29 July starring Joanna Ampil as Kim and Peter Cousens as Chris. This original production was too big to tour.

2007

AUSTRALIAN RETURN

Opened at Her Majesty's Theatre, Melbourne on 29 March 2007 starring Laurie Cadevida as Kim and David Harris as Chris and subsequently toured to Brisbane, Sydney, Adelaide and Perth.

2014 - 2016

WEST END

To celebrate the 25th Anniversary of Miss Saigon, a London revival opened in May 2014. This production broke box office records on its first day of ticket sales, taking £44.4 Million. The cast was drawn from 18 different countries around the world.

2017

BROADWAY REVIVAL

The West End production of Miss Saigon transferred to Broadway on 23 March 2017 for a limited engagement through 14 January 2018. The production was nominated for two Tonys® for Best Revival of a Musical and Best Actress in a Leading Role in a Musical.

2023

NEW AUSTRALIAN PRODUCTION

Cameron Mackintosh's new production premieres at the Sydney Opera House, 25 August.



THE CREATIVES

CAMERON MACKINTOSH ★ **PRODUCER**

Cameron Mackintosh has been producing shows since 1967 and remains the world's most prolific producer of musicals in theatre history. As well as producing three of the world's longest running musicals — Les Misérables, The Phantom of the Opera and Cats — his legendary productions include Miss Saigon, Oliver!, Mary Poppins (co-produced with Disney), Side By Side By Sondheim, Little Shop of Horrors, Song and Dance, Tomfoolery, Martin Guerre, The Witches of Eastwick and Five Guys Named Moe. His acclaimed productions of My Fair Lady, Oklahoma! and Carousel have all been international successes, as have his reinvented new productions of Les Misérables, Miss Saigon and The Phantom of the Opera.

Cameron is also co-producer with Jeffrey Seller of Hamilton in London.

In 2013, alongside Working Title Films and Universal, Cameron produced the hugely successful Oscar®, Golden Globe and BAFTA award-winning film adaptation of Les Misérables, which is one of the most successful movies ever of an original stage musical. The concert version of Les Misérables, which was first staged in 1989 at Domain Park in Sydney, has proved to be just as successful as the staged musical around the world. It has been filmed three times — at the Royal Albert Hall, the O2 Arena and the Gielaud Theatre and is continually re-screened on TV and in cinemas throughout the world and, alongside his spectacular Royal Albert Hall production of The Phantom of the Opera, regularly breaks attendance records for live recording performances of musical theatre.

Cameron owns and operates eight historic London theatres, which have all been spectacularly rebuilt and refurbished for the 21st century. They house many of London's successful hits. The Sondheim, formerly known as the Queen's, has been rebuilt and renamed in honour of Cameron's great friend, theatrical legend Stephen Sondheim, who recently died. Following its unforgettable sell-out success at the Sondheim Theatre in May 2022, Old Friends - the all-star spectacular celebration of Stephen's life and work — was broadcast on television to huge critical acclaim and will return for a limited run at the Gielgud Theatre in September 2023, with many of the original stars from the Gala.

In 1990, Cameron inaugurated the Chair of Contemporary Theatre at St Catherine's College in Oxford University, with Stephen Sondheim as his visiting professor. Music Theatre International, the world's largest owner of secondary rights to many of the greatest musicals ever written, is now one of Cameron's companies. Cameron was knighted in the 1996 New Year's Honours for his services to British theatre and he is the first British producer ever to be elected to Broadway's Theater Hall of Fame.



ALAIN BOUBLIL * BOOK AND LYRIC

Alain Boublil is the author of the librettos and lyrics for the musicals *La Révolution Française* (celebrating its 50th Anniversary this year!), *Les Misérables, Miss Saigon, Martin Guerre*, and *The Pirate Queen*, all in collaboration with Claude-Michel Schönberg, as well as *Marguerite* with music by Michel Legrand. He also co-produced the original cast albums of all his shows. He co-wrote the screenplay of the Golden Globe-winning and Oscar-nominated film, *Les Misérables*. He is the author/lyricist of *Abbacadabra*, a fairy tale musical including ABBA classic songs, of the stage adaptation of the Demy/Legrand film, *Les Demoiselles de Rochefort*, as well as author of the musical play, *Manhattan Parisienne*, and the play, *The Diary of Adam and Eve*. He wrote a prize-winning French novel, *Les dessous de soi*.

His many awards include two Tonys, two Grammys, two Victoire de la Musique and a Molière Award for Les Misérables as well as an Evening Standard Drama Award for Miss Saigon, a Laurence Olivier Award for Martin Guerre and a New York Chapter Honors Grammy for his outstanding contribution to the creative community.

Boublil and Schönberg's 40 plus year collaboration was celebrated in May 2016 at Carnegie Hall as honourees of the New York Pops' 33rd Birthday Gala. Alain devised and is the executive producer of the Do You Hear The People Sing? concerts, a symphonic promenade through Boublil and Schönberg musical history, which played sold out concerts in Melbourne Arts Centre and the Sydney Opera House last September/October. He is long married to singer, actress, director, Marie Zamora, the Paris Cosette, and is the father of four sons.

CLAUDE-MICHEL SCHÖNBERG ★ CONCEPT, BOOK AND MUSIC

Born in 1944 to Hungarian parents, Claude-Michel Schönberg began his career in France as a singer, writer and producer of pop songs.

In collaboration with Alain Boublil, he is the book co-writer and the composer of La Révolution Française, Les Misérables, Miss Saigon, Martin Guerre and The Pirate Queen. In 2008, his musical Marguerite, in collaboration with Alain Boublil, Michel Legrand and Herbert Kretzmer, opened at the Haymarket Theatre in London.

Schönberg has supervised overseas productions and co-produced several international cast albums of his shows. In 2001, he composed his first ballet score, *Wuthering Heights*, which was created by the Northern Ballet in 2002. His ballet *Cleopatra*, which opened in 2011, was his second collaboration with David Nixon and his seventh complete score. In 2012, Schönberg co-wrote the screenplay and re-conceived the music for the *Les Misérables musical* movie.

His shows have won many awards over the years, most recently the WhatsonStage audience awards for Best West End Show and Best Musical Revival for the London production of *Miss Saigon*. Golden Globe winner, Oscar nominee and Grammy Award winner for his outstanding contribution to the creative community, Schönberg and Alain Boublil were honoured at a New York Pops gala concert in Carnegie Hall celebrating their 40-year collaboration.

Schönberg was appointed Visiting Professor of Contemporary Theatre at St. Catherine's College, Oxford University and is now an Emeritus Fellow. He is an Honorary Member of the Royal Academy of Music where he is a guest Professor. Schönberg married the English ballerina, Charlotte Talbot, in 2003. He is the father of one son and two daughters.

He served as premiere English lyricist for Boublil & Schönberg's La Revolution Française and contributed lyrics to Russell Watson's album Only One Man. Michael's work is available through MTI, Broadway Licensing, and Dramatic Publishing.

WILLIAM DAVID BROHN 🖈 ORCHESTRATIONS

William "Bill" Brohn, was one of musical theatre's top orchestrators, who worked on dozens of West End and Broadway shows and won a Tony in 1998 for *Ragtime*, Bill collaborated 11 times over nearly 30 years as orchestrator for his favourite producer Cameron Mackintosh, from *Miss Saigon* in 1989 to the 2017 West End revival of *Half a Sixpence*.

Orchestrators determine the flavour of a musical's score by assigning the instruments and deciding which ones the musicians will play and when. Bill recalled in in an essay

in "The Alchemy of Theatre" (2006), that he cried when Claude-Michel Schönberg sang songs in French from Miss Saigon.

"That music is the reason for your existence at this moment, and the central focus for you is to help the composer say what he wants to say."

BOB AVIAN * MUSICAL STAGING

Bob began his professional career as a dancer and was in more than a dozen Broadway shows including West Side Story, Funny Girl and Henry, Sweet Henry. He then became an integral part of every Michael Bennett production for the next 20 years, working as Associate Choreographer and Assistant Director on productions including Promises, Promises, Coco, Company, Follies, Twigs, Seesaw and God's Favorite. In 1976 he received his first Tony Award as co-choreographer of A Chorus Line and won his next Tony Award for co-choreographing Ballroom as well as serving as producer. He was also a lead producer on the original and national companies of Dreamgirls, the acclaimed musical which won six Tony Awards.He next choreographed the London premiere of Follies and then created the musical staging for Miss Saigon, both for producer Cameron Mackintosh. He did the musical staging for Andrew Lloyd Webber's Sunset Boulevard both in London and on Broadway, receiving his sixth Tony nomination. Next came

the Boublil and Schönberg musical Martin Guerre in London for which he received the prestigious Olivier Award for Best Choreography. Bob also choreographed Stephen Sondheim's Putting it Together off-Broadway at the Manhattan Theatre Club starring Julie Andrews and then on Broadway starring Carol Burnett. Returning to London, he choreographed The Witches of Eastwick in the West End starring Ian McShane. He came back to Broadway where he directed the 2006 hit revival of A Chorus Line and starred in the documentary Every Little Step which followed the audition process of that production. He also directed the London revival of A Chorus Line at the Palladium in 2013 followed by productions at the Hollywood Bowl and New York's City Center in 2018. In 2020, his memoir Dancing Man: A Broadway Choreographer's Journey was published by University Press of Mississippi.

ANDREANE NEOFITOU ★ COSTUME DESIGNER

Internationally renowned costume designer Andy Neofitou's highly acclaimed work for the Royal Shakespeare Company over many years led to her outstanding success with Les Miserables directed by Trevor Nunn and John Caird, and her beautifully researched and detailed costumes won her a coveted Tony Award Nomination on Broadway. Andy continued to work on the show since its 're-conception' in 2009, the 25th Anniversary performance at London's 02 Arena in 2010, and subsequent productions and tours in the UK, the United States, Canada, Australia, Japan and Europe — all as the London production continues its record-breaking run in the West End. Her costumes for Miss Saigon first directed by Nicholas Hytner at the Theatre Royal Drury Lane, have gone on to become another huge and continuing international hit.

Andy's other costume designs in London and the West End include the highly successful Grease which began lifeat the Dominion Theatre, went on to the Piccadilly Theatre and a long running tour of the UK and Europe, Gone With The Wind and The Baker's Wife both directed by Trevor Nunn, The Far Pavilions, Timon Of Athens at the Young Vic with David Suchet in the title role, also directed by Trevor Nunn, Peter Pan at the Royal National Theatre directed by John Caird, and the arena production of Bizet's opera Carmen at The Royal Albert Hall.

Among Andy's many international credits are *Nabucco* directed by Elijah Moshinsky for New York's Metropolitan Opera, *Miss Julie* in Athens, the musical *Jane Eyre* directed by John Caird on Broadway - for which she received an Outer Critics Circle Award nomination - and Cameron Mackintosh's revised version of *Martin Guerre* also in the United States.

Her designs for the Royal Shakespeare Company include *The Changeling* directed by Michael Attenborough, Bill Alexander's production of *The Merchant Of Venice* with Antony Sher, and *Fair Maid Of The West* directed by Trevor Nunn which was the inaugural production at the Swan Theatre at Stratford and later transferred to the Mermaid Theatre in London. She designed the costumes for *Hedda Gabler* with Glenda Jackson at the Aldwych, in Canada and the USA; *Once In A Lifetime* at the Aldwych and the Piccadilly; *Peter Pan* which enjoyed three separate runs at the Barbican, and *Nicholas Nickleby* at Stratford and in the United States winning the Outer Circle Critics' Award for Outstanding Achievement in Costume Design.

Among Andy's film credits are Rosencrantz And Guildenstern Are Dead starring Richard Dreyfuss directed by the author Tom Stoppard, and Still Life with Roger Daltrey.

Totie has spent the last 25 years working on numerous stage designs for the National Theatre, Royal Shakespeare Company, Donmar Warehouse, Theatre de Complicite, Glynedebourne, and London's West End. As a composer, Alfonso has composed the music for the feature films *Venus*, and *Héroes de Barrio*, as well as jingles for Disney, Nickelodeon, advertising companies etc. His work in Film and TV includes the translation and direction of many Disney shows in Spanish (*Tangled, Fancy Nancy, TOPS, Mira Royal Detective, Gigantosaurus, Phineas and Ferb, Spongbob Square pants... etc)*

He started conducting professional shows at the age of 20 in Madrid, and since then he has conducted and supervised shows in Spain, United Kingdom, Japan, United Emirates, Germany, China, Brazil... etc.

Major credits in musical theatre include Les Misérables (MD/Supervisor, Spain, Brazil, Tokyo, London and Dubai), Miss Saigon (MD/Supervisor London and Tokyo), The Phantom of the Opera (MD/ Supervisor London and UK Tour), Mamma Mia! (Spain MD — International Asst. Musical Supervisor)

He conducted the 25th anniversary Gala of Miss Saigon (released on DVD worldwide), Les Misérables — The staged concert at the Gielgud Theatre in London (also released worldwide on video) and was co-supervisor for Les Misérables 30th Anniversary Gala.

He recorded an all Spanish classical music album with the BBCCO in January 2018 alongside soloists Juan Pérez and Magdalena Llamas and he conducted this orchestra again in August 2018 for "Friday night is music night".

Awards include Best Musical director in Spain for Les Misérables and Best Musical director in the West End for Miss Saigon. (Broadway World Awards).

Guy Simpson has been working as a Conductor, Orchestrator, Musical Director and Musical Supervisor for almost 45 years.

He has been involved with *Miss Saigon* for 35 years - starting as the audition pianist in 1988 on the search for the original Kim for the London production. He then went on to become the Musical Director of the show in Australia in 1995 and again in 2007. He has also conducted or supervised productions in Manila, Hong Kong, Singapore, Brazil, Seoul, The Netherlands and Japan.

Guy's work on *The Phantom of the Opera* began in Australia in 1990. He has conducted or supervised productions in Auckland, Cape Town, Pretoria, Johannesburg, Shanghai, Taipei, Hong Kong, Brazil, Manila, Bangkok, Singapore, Guangzhou, Beijing and Seoul.

Last year he conducted *The Phantom of the Opera* on Sydney Harbour and was Musical Supervisor of the show at the Sydney Opera House and Arts Centre Melbourne for Opera Australia.

For Opera Australia he was Musical Director and Supervisor of *Evita* (starring Tina Arena), the 60th anniversary production of *My Fair Lady* (directed by Julie Andrews) and *West Side Story* (on the Sydney Harbour). He was Musical Supervisor of *Cinderella*.
